## EU Settlement Scheme: What Happens Next?

### Home Office Status Outcome

- Keep your status outcome letter in a safe place.
- We recommend that you print and file this letter in an email directory so that it can be easily retrieved at a later date.
- Please note that status outcome letter is not proof of your status. Your proof of status will be accessed by logging into your online portal.

### Logging Into The Portal

You can prove your status via the Home Office online status service 'View and Prove your Settled and Pre-Settled Status': <https://www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status>. Below is the information you will need to have to log into your portal:

- A code will be sent to you to access your portal

You will need to tell the Home Office if you change your contact email, phone number or ID document. To do this, log into your status portal. Alternatively, call the EU Resolution Centre on 0300 123 7379.

### Conditions with Pre-Settled Status

**WHEN** and **HOW** to convert to Settled status:

- You will need to make a future application to apply for Settled status once you have reached five years continuous residence in the UK. You must do this **before** the date of your Pre-settled status expires.
- If you leave the UK for more than two consecutive years, your pre-settled status will be cancelled, and you will need to make a new application.

\*It is important to keep absences to a minimum as this will affect your eligibility of being granted Settled status. New criminal convictions may also affect your future status.

**\*There is a date of expiry for Pre-settled status:**

**\*You will need to convert your status to Settled status before this date**

**Absences:** To be able to apply in the future for Settled status, you cannot spend more than 6 months away from the UK in a 12-month period (exceptions may apply).
